

Personal Statement

My first throughts of entering the dental field were sparked when I met my orthodontist in my sophomore year of high school. In his office, the doctor walked in, greeted me, and we talked about braces. He seemed very happy and relaxed, so I asked him about his job. "I couldn't see myself doing anything else," he responded. Throughout my entire process of having braces, he was calm and reassuring. He also did a great job straightening my teeth, which made me feel positive about my appearance. It was during this time that I became intrigued to pursue dentistry.

I soon learned just how much work and time it requires to become a dentist. At that time, I did not think I had the skills and determination to do what this career would require. In my freshman year of college, I was not sure about what I career I was

interested in, so I chose to pursue a business degree. When the time came to choose classes for the spring, I had three options for a biology elective. Two of the choices were easy classes and the third was a more difficult option. I chose the third option because I wanted to challenge myself to see if I could handle the more involved biology course. This was the first really difficult class I had ever voluntarily chosen to take. For the first time, I began to seriously study for a class. More importantly, for the first time, I began to really enjoy school and the material that I was learning. If I did well in this class, then I decided that I would give the dental field more consideration. I finished in the top tier of the class and that experience helped me decide to pursue dentistry.

Entering my sophomore year, I switched my major to biology. I have been happier in this program and school has been more enjoyable for me after this decision. To catch up academically, I have taken on heavy class loads. But I have never felt overwhelmed and I have enjoyed the challenge. At times, the combined coursework can be demanding, but I have always been able to remain relaxed in stressful situations. To balance my life, I still had time to play sports, participate in clubs, go to the gym, socialize with friends, and complete my residential assistant (RA) responsibilites, all while maintaining excellent grades. The reason I have this free time is because when I need to study or do school work, I get very focused, then work diligently and efficiently. I do not find many people with a strong work ethic like mine and I believe this is because I was brought up differently than most people my age.

Unlike most of my peers, my family has always lived in a house with a large yard and a big garden. I did not begin to appreciate this until recently. I have heard many friends complain about the 30 minutes it takes them to mow a small yard just as they complain about working on a school project. I would much rather be working on a project for 3 hours than weeding our family garden. I have also learned to appreciate school work because I prefer to use my mental skills than be doing manual labor in our yard. This has reinforced me to value an advanced education.

Being an RA has made me a more mature person. At times, living in a freshman dorm has made me feel like a parent of 50 adolescents. It takes more work to be an RA in a freshman dorm than in an upperclass dorm, but I knew that is where I could make the biggest impact. Freshman need more advice and support than older students and I feel that I really care about helping them make a smooth transaction into college life. Through my experiences as an RA, I have learned to manage and work with a diverse group of people. I believe that I can also use these skills to work well with people in dentistry.

I feel I would be a valuable addition to the dentistry field due to my work ethic, caring personality, and my leadership abilities. Leadership roles are something that I like to take on. I have been a leader in boy scouts, clubs, teams, and as an RA. When in a leadership position, I like to do what is best for the group. Helping people is something that I find fulfilling and rewarding. From my shadowing experience, I have found that I would really enjoy a future in dentistry. Dental healthcare is very important and I want to have a job that can make a positive impact on others. Dentistry gives me the opportunity to help others while doing something that I believe I would enjoy.
